This 21 ha park includes over 10 hectares of native bushland, offering fabulous bird viewing including the Eurasian Coot.

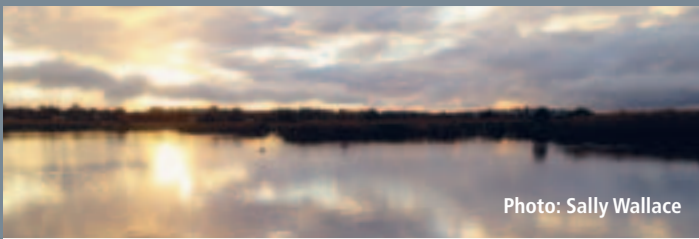

Significant to the Aboriginal people, the lakes were historically used as a fishing hole. Look for the amazingly camouflaged Tawny Frogmouth found here.
